The members of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, Xi Zeta Omega Chapter invite students to participate in our annual Youth Arts Contest, a Chapter activity sponsored by The Ivy Foundation. This year's contest will be held virtually.

The purpose of the Youth Arts Contest is to expose students to arts enrichment and culture by focusing on visual and performing arts and showcasing talent through the exploration of writers, entertainers, and various other artists. The theme of this year's contest is *"Black Art Matters! Stand Up for the Harlem Renaissance and the Black Arts Movements - Past and Present."* 

The contest is open to students in grades 6 through 12 who live or attend school in the greater Washington DC metropolitan area. We are making a special outreach to include students who live or attend schools in the areas identified in our Sorority Region as "Cluster 1": Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Charles, Howard, Montgomery, and Prince George's Counties, as well as Baltimore City. Students will have the opportunity to compete in one of the four following categories: Spoken Word, Visual Arts, Dance, or Music. The top three entries in each category for both middle and high school students will receive a monetary award up to \$200.00. In total, we will award a total of \$2,800 to students!

# Contest Theme

The 2021 Youth Arts Contest "Black Art Matters! Stand up for the Harlem Renaissance and the Black Arts Movements - Past and Present" highlights the African American artists involved with the Harlem Renaissance, the Black Arts Movement of 1965-1975, and the modern-day Black Arts Movement. These three periods of time showcase the extraordinary contributions of African Americans to the arts and the political movements of the times.

The Harlem Renaissance, which spanned the 1920s and 1930s, celebrates the intellectual and cultural revival of African American music, art, dance, fashion, literature, and politics. Though centered in Harlem, NY, the Renaissance was also strongly influenced by artists and social critics in Washington, DC, and other urban areas in the Northeast and Midwest United States.

The Black Arts Movement champions artistic works that brought attention to the Black Power Movement of 1965 to 1975, which included politically-motivated poets, artists, dramatists, musicians, and writers who focused on activism. The Black Arts Movement emerged in the wake of the Black Power Movement, conveying a message of Black pride and self-determination for Black people. This movement helped lay the foundation for modern-day spoken word, hip-hop, and other artistic expressions.

The modern-day Black Arts Movement focuses on artistic expressions that combine activism and arts influenced by calls for social justice, reductions to police brutality, emphasis on voter engagement, combating voter suppression, advocating for the rights of immigrant and indigenous communities, and reducing economic/racial/gender disparities that have a particular impact on the Black community.

These themes will be interpreted via one of the following art forms available for student entries: **Spoken Word, Visual Arts, Dance, or Music**.

# **Contest Eligibility**

To be a contestant, students must live or attend school in the greater Washington DC metropolitan area. We are making a special outreach to include students who live or attend schools in the areas identified in our Sorority Region as "Cluster 1": Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Charles, Howard, Montgomery, and Prince George's Counties, as well as Baltimore City. Eligible students must be in the 6<sup>th</sup> grade through 12<sup>th</sup> grade at the time of the Contest.

# **Competition Rules**

Rules specific to the four Contest categories - Spoken Word, Visual Arts, Dance, and Music - are provided below. Please note that <u>all</u> Contest submissions require a pre-recorded video. All submissions <u>must</u> be aligned with the Contest theme, *Black Art Matters! Stand up for the Harlem Renaissance and the Black Arts Movements - Past and Present*.

For judging purposes, contestants will be separated into two grade levels: Level I is grades  $6^{th} - 8^{th}$  and Level 2 is grades  $9^{th} - 12^{th}$ . For each category, a group submission will be allowed composed of no more than four students. All students in a group must be eligible for the same level. Contestants are eligible for only one level and can only submit in one category.

Submissions will be evaluated based on quality, content, delivery style, interpretation, organization, and creativity. Where applicable, submissions will also be judged on technique, craftsmanship, integration, and impression.

All submissions will be reviewed against Contest guidelines (provided below for each category). A panel of judges will evaluate those meeting the minimum requirements. All decisions are final and not subject to appeal.

### Spoken Word

Includes the recitation of a speech or poetry; dramatic performance of a monologue; or presentation of original spoken word or poetry. Students are encouraged to memorize their presentations.

Submission: Video recording of recitation/performance of the selected piece. The contestant must make a statement at the beginning of the presentation to introduce themselves, explain why the particular piece or excerpt was chosen or created, and describe how it relates to the Contest theme.

Timing: Presentations must be at least 2 minutes and no longer than 5 minutes. This time limit does not include any introduction or description of the performance.

#### Visual Arts

Includes an original artistic rendering (such as paintings, sketches, photographs, or sculptures); or supportive artistry (such as the design and display of costumes, apparel, textiles, or set design). Art pieces do not have to be framed.

Submission: Video recording displaying clear images of the artwork or the supportive artistry. In addition to an image of the front of the visual art, contestants are encouraged to provide a multi-dimensional view of their art. This may be a 360 degree/full-circle view or moving the recording device to different parts of the submission to capture unique aspects in greater detail. The contestant must provide a statement introducing themselves, describing the visual art, and explaining its relation to the Contest theme.

Timing: Presentations of the visual art must be at least 3 minutes and no longer than 5 minutes.

#### Music

Includes vocal or instrumental performance of an original or published musical composition. Vocal performances may be done with accompaniment. However, only the contestant will be judged and considered for an award.

Submission: Video recording of a performance of the selected piece. The contestant must make a statement at the beginning of the presentation to introduce themselves and explain why the particular piece or excerpt was chosen or created and how it relates to the Contest theme.

Timing: Presentations must be at least 3 minutes and no longer than 5 minutes. This time limit does not include any introduction or description of the performance.

#### Dance

Includes performance of an original or existing dance composition. All genres of dance are acceptable. Dance performances may be done with musical accompaniment. However, only the contestant will be judged and considered for an award.

Submission: Video recording of a performance of the selected piece. The contestant must make a statement at the beginning of the presentation to introduce themselves and explain why the particular piece or excerpt was chosen or created and how it relates to the Contest theme.

Timing: Presentations must be at least 3 minutes and no longer than 5 minutes. This time limit does not include any introduction or description of the performance.

# **Contest Awards**

First place, second place, and honorable mention will be selected for each category within each grade-level group. The winner or winning group will receive a one-time monetary award in the following amounts: First Place - \$200, Second Place - \$100, and Honorable Mention - \$50. If a group places, the award amount will be divided equally among the group members.

May 23, 2021	Winners will be announced at a special virtual event.
June 19, 2021	Winners and their submissions will be presented at our 2021 Youth Arts Contest Culminating Event. This is a virtual event.
